1 THE HISTORY AND PHYSICAL (H & P) I Chief Complaint Why the patient came to the hospital Should be written in the patient's own words II History of Present Illness (HPI) a chronologic account of the major problem for which the patient is seeking medical care

#### **PCM Guidebook for History Taking and Physical Exams**

1 Consider summarizing key history and physical exam findings 2 Provide an explanation of what you think is going on - working diagnosis, other possible diagnoses 3 Provide specific next steps 4 Ask patient/family if they have questions 5 Ensure understanding - "teach-back" 6 Thank patient

#### **PATIENT HISTORY PHYSICAL EXAMINATION**

Making a diagnosis 1 Anamnesis = history taking 2 Physical examination -inspection, palpation, percussion, auscultation, vital signs, weight, height 3 Working
